BWC GRACES “THE PHILIPPINE FEDERATION OF CREDIT COOPERATIVES - PFCCO-NCR COOPERATIVES MANAGERS’ CLUB FORUM”

The Philippine Federation of Credit Cooperatives Organization-PFFCO-NCR Cooperatives Managers’ Club recently organized a learning session for its members last October 25, 2018 at Seda Vertis North, Diliman, QC. The activity was attended by close to 200 members.

Dr. Marco Antonio Valeros, Medical Officer IV of BWC spoke on the two topics: DO 183 s. 2017 “Revised Rules on the Administration and Enforcement of Labor Laws Pursuant to Article 128 of the Labor Code of the Philippines as renumbered” and RA 11058 “An Act Strengthening Compliance with Occupational Safety and Standards and Providing Penalties for Violations Thereof.”

In the two presentations, Dr. Valeros discussed the legal bases, salient features and importance and benefit of compliance to labor standards. But more than the enactment of these two legislations, Dr. Valeros stressed the close collaboration amongst the different stakeholders both public and private in the achievement of our country’s goal on productivity as the key to its success.
