DOLE conducts first 10-day nationwide virtual competency training for newly appointed Labor Inspectors

The Department of Labor and Employment, through the Bureau of Working Conditions and the Human Resource and Development Service, conducted its first nationwide 10-day virtual competency training held from May 24 to June 4, 2021. This was attended by forty-seven (47) newly appointed Labor Inspectors from DOLE's Regional Offices nationwide.

It aims to educate the Department's newly appointed Labor Inspectors on General Labor Standards and Labor Law Compliance System, particularly on the application and implementation of the Revised Rules on the Administration and Enforcement of Labor Laws in the conduct of inspection and compliance visits.

The program comprises of six (6) modules covering the following topics: Performance Standards, General Labor Standards (wage-related and special laws), Labor Relations, Occupational Safety and Health Standards, and Practical Application.

In view of the restrictions brought by the COVID-19 pandemic, the training was conducted online by means of virtual lectures, case studies, and breakout sessions, and use of online interactive training tools.

The Department values the importance of developing its human resources in fulfilling its mission of protecting workers and promoting their welfare and maintaining industrial peace. Towards this end, it believes that competency trainings and enhancements play a vital role in honing labor inspectors and capacitating them in delivering the best service to the clientele of the Department through the conduct of sound, effective, and efficient labor inspection.

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
